Dear Travel Enthusiasts,






Best Time to Visit:

Pahalgam





Designed in harmony with Persian influences, its twelve terraces symbolize the twelve zodiac signs, inviting wanderers to immerse themselves in its lush greenery and majestic chinar trees.

In Anantnag, one finds the enchanting Achabal Garden, affectionately called “The Place of the Prince.” Constructed by Jahangir for his cherished wife, Nur Jahan, this garden is renowned for its cascading waterfalls, rich greenery, and impressive chinar trees that speak to the romance of its storied past.





The Verinag Mughal Garden, positioned at the formidable entry point of the Kashmir Valley, has earned the title of the “Gateway of Kashmir.” Built around the Verinag Spring, the source of the Jhelum River, this tranquil haven is adorned with ancient chinar trees and vibrant meadows, inviting a contemplative stroll through its lush surroundings.

Lastly, the *Harwan Garden*, situated approximately 18 kilometers from Srinagar, serves as a beloved retreat for picnickers, featuring a waterway flowing from a nearby dam, lined by chinar trees, creating a peaceful sanctuary for all who venture there.
